New Mexico Corrections Department Celebrates Largest Corrections Officer Graduation of 2023

Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham attends graduation ceremony in Santa Fe

Santa Fe - The New Mexico Corrections Department (NMCD) is proud to announce its largest graduation of corrections officers of the year. The graduation is comprised of 31 correctional officer cadets and 16 correctional officer specialists. Together, the classes produce 47 graduates and honorary correctional officer, 20-year-old William Archuleta, who tragically lost his life in a vehicle crash on Halloween while driving home from training.

Your ability to rise above adversity is inspiring, and it serves as a testament to your character."

The graduation ceremony, held earlier today, marks a significant milestone for both NMCD and the state as a whole. NMCD facilities across the state have worked tirelessly to recruit a diverse group of professionals who are dedicated to upholding public safety, while maintaining safety and security within the state's correctional system.

The event was attended by distinguished guests, including Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham, NMCD Cabinet Secretary Alisha Tafoya Lucero, department leadership, family members and friends of the graduating classes. The ceremony showcased the graduates' remarkable achievements and celebrated their successful completion of intensive training programs, which encompassed a wide range of topics from de-escalation and communication techniques, to use of force, and defensive tactics. The addition of these highly trained corrections officers to the department's workforce will further enable NMCD to maintain safe and secure environments for staff, inmates, and surrounding communities.

The New Mexico Corrections Training Academy (NMCTA) is responsible for conducting basic and advanced training for custody and non-custody staff. NMCTA was created in 1981 and was the first corrections training academy in the nation.
