NMCD hits new heights in high school equivalency goals

HSE credentials continue to climb

SANTA FE — The New Mexico Corrections Department not only surpassed the Legislative Finance Committee's target for high school equivalency graduates for the second consecutive year in Fiscal Year 2024 but also continues to lead the state compared to other adult education programs.

"Educational achievements lead to more gainful employment opportunities and better financial outcomes for our communities," said **NMCD Cabinet Secretary Alisha Tafoya Lucero**. "As our department moves forward, we remain committed on increasing access to education and supporting individuals on their journey toward successful reintegration."

Fiscal Year 2024

- NMCD awarded 236 HSE credentials.

Fiscal Year 2023

• NMCD awarded 184 HSE credentials, a year-over-year increase of 22 percent.

The successful graduation rates are attributed to the leadership of Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham, Corrections Cabinet Secretary Alisha Tafoya Lucero, and the NMCD Reentry Division, along with the collaborative support from the New Mexico Higher Education Department (NMHED).
