## NMCD surpasses high school equivalency goals for third year

SANTA FE – For the third consecutive year, the New Mexico Corrections Department (NMCD) recorded the highest number of high school equivalency (HSE) graduates in the state in Fiscal Year 2025, surpassing the Legislative Finance Committee's (LFC) target and continuing to lead New Mexico in adult education outcomes.

"A high school education is essential for securing gainful employment and reducing recidivism," said **NMCD Cabinet Secretary Alisha Tafoya Lucero.** "This achievement reflects the hard work and dedication of our Reentry Division staff, including our outstanding educators and facility teams. It would not have been possible without the strong leadership of Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham and our vital partnership with the New Mexico Higher Education Department."
